Latin America is undergoing rapid change. This is not a new statement, but it is gaining momentum as it refers to accelerated changes taking place in a context of marked contrasts, including extreme political polarization. Traditional and serious challenges in the region, such as widespread labor market informality, profound social inequality, or much-needed state reforms, must now be addressed in the context of constant political and social tensions, often with seemingly irreconcilable policy proposals, and a public sphere that is being transformed by new digital technologies that are reconfiguring modes of participation and understandings of what is "public". In this two-day workshop at the Swiss School of Latin American Studies, we will bring together scholars from different disciplines to address questions related to the aforementioned political polarization and its impact on democratic institutions in the region.
